Starting with the direct accompaniment of five congregations in themes that they chose, ranging from the transformation of conflicts to the right to education; we will be holding numerous workshops, mapping community assets to get involved in these issues and creating more resources for the communities.

We will also be writing study guides, community-based devotions, as well as a new book of liturgies focused on celebrating/commemorating/observing international days connected to peace and justice, such as December 10, which is the international day of human rights, or March 8 which is international women's day.

This will be in addition to working with and through our ecumenical partners in promoting peace through justice in a country going through a seemingly successful peace process after more than 50 years of armed conflict. It is an exciting year ahead. Please keep all the work of the human rights program as well as all the ministries of IELCO in your thoughts and prayers.
