#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

The Church's liturgical calendar follows cycles of celebrations and emphases. Christmas and Easter are highlights in this rhythm. Advent and Lent are seasons of preparation for these celebrations. After the Easter season comes the season of Pentecost, which starts with the day of (ironically) Pentecost.

In Judaism, Pentecost is a harvest celebration where the first fruits of the wheat harvest are dedicated to God. It is also connected to the giving of the Law to Moses. Jewish people in the first century would travel to the Temple in Jerusalem for this Holy Day. It was during this celebration, the first one since Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, that the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples. The Spirit moved the disciples from their locked room into the street. There, they began telling about Jesus and his salvation. Everyone there was able to understand the words of the disciples no matter their native language.

The Day of Pentecost is a celebration of the Spirit's presence with the Church. It also points Christians beyond the church building toward the world, so we can tell about Jesus and all he has done and continues to do. Fire is the symbol of the Holy Spirit, and the color of the day is red.

The following Sunday is Holy Trinity Sunday. We focus upon the doctrine of the Trinity. We explore the nature of God, the three in one and one in three.

Then we have the long season of Pentecost. That season will actually continue until December. The color is green, signifying growth. The weekly readings will consist of |Jesus' teachings and parables and miracles. Some denominations call this "Ordinary Time". This season of Pentecost is not focused on celebrations and festivals. Rather, it reminds us of the importance of the routine of following Jesus day in and day out. The "green season" can feel like a list of those things we ought to do. They are not glamorous, but they are profound. You know: eat healthy foods (especially your veggies), exercise, connect with people, have some alone time, give focus to an activity or hobby. These are some of the ingredients to a healthy and happy life.

Like the list above, the things that disciples do can seem tame and manageable: connect with God through Scripture and prayer, show care for another through an act of service, look for the presence of God in the people and events around you. Be open to the movement of the Spirit within yourself. These are life giving and life changing practices.

**Secretarial Report-** The sentence about the state giving our school the money for repairing the radon issue, under the Property committee report, should be omitted because they have to apply for that. Motion to approve amended minutes of the 2-26-2024 Council Meeting by Gloria, second by Scott. Motion carried.

**Treasurer's and Finance Committee Report**- Report by Scott. The computer was fixed for \$200. Motion to approve report by Cathy. Larry seconded it. Motion carried.

#### **Committee Reports:**

**Christian Life-** A written report listed many ideas for social events that our church may host. They would like to host one social event per month.

Memorial- No meeting

Parish Education- No meeting

**Property Committee**-Larry reported that the radon issue in our educational wing has been improved so far by installing one fan unit. They paid \$3,000 to fix it. They voted to have TriState Gutters fix the Eastside door that fell down from the ice on the roof. Spring cleanup day will be May 19th. The question of whether to raise the rent for the preschool was discussed and Sam made a motion to not raise the rent and Ariel seconded it, as they have been good for the community and pay for needs that come up. Motion carried to not raise the preschool's rent.

**Staff Support**- Sam reported they are considering changing the staff performance evaluation process. They are planning to take the staff out for a meal on April 24th.

**Women of Grace**- Cathy reported the cheesecake sale will be moved to Mother's Day. The PPE needed in the kitchen is here and a poster explaining how to use it.

**Worship and Music** - We voted to pay for a power supply for our sound system for \$150 and a component for \$120 both diagnosed by Trent.

**Pastor's Thoughts** - Loaves and Fishes will resume serving meals at our church on the fourth Sundays of the month and will start May 26th. New Member classes are beginning this week.

**Old Business** - The Audio-Visual job position update is that one person is interested and Trent will talk to them and train whoever accepts the position.

**New Business-** Bill Holland spoke to the Council regarding the United to Amend (UTA) (Campaign finance reform) resolution that can be signed. He described the purpose stated by ELCA congregations that have approved a resolution in favor of UTA. Scott made a motion to discuss it for our synod and Sam se-
